

HOW TO GET TO STRADDIE

- All ferries depart from Cleveland (which is about a 50 min drive from Brisbane City) and arrive at Dunwich, North Stradbroke Island.
- You can drive onto a vehicle ferry or park your car on the street near the ferry terminal for free and catch a passenger ferry.
- Vehicle ferries and passenger ferries depart and return hourly throughout the day/early evening - refer to websites below for times.
- The vehicle ferries take 50 mins and the passenger ferries take 25 mins each way.
- All ferries arrive at Dunwich and then you can drive or catch a bus to Amity Point or Point Lookout. NB Selected bus services go to Amity Point, all buses go to Point Lookout.
- It takes about 20 mins to Amity Point and about 25 mins to Point Lookout.
- Main roads to the towns & within the towns are sealed – you don't need a 4WD.

AMITY POINT

- Amity Point is a charming seaside town.
- It is on the bayside of the island and looks back towards Brisbane & across to Moreton Island.
- Amity has a camping ground next to the beach, holiday cabins & houses, a jetty for fishing, a boat ramp, a general store with fuel, a café, a fresh seafood outlet and a club.



POINT LOOKOUT

- Point Lookout is on the ocean side of the island and has surf beaches, a range of holiday accommodation - apartments and houses, resorts & camping - cafes & restaurants, the Stradbroke Hotel, a surf club and bowling club.
- There are swimming and surfing beaches, beaches for 4 wheel driving and fishing. Flinders and Home beach are pet friendly.
- The famous Gorge Walk is at Point Lookout, across from Fishes Café. It's an easy walk – it takes about 30mins or a bit longer if you want to stop and enjoy the spectacular views, which will often include marine life such as turtles, dolphins & in winter - humpback whales.



DUNWICH

- Dunwich is the arrival point for passenger & vehicle ferries to Straddie.
- Dunwich is on the bay side of the island & suitable for boats - note the tides.
- The town has mostly permanent residents & has a range of shops & amenities – grocery stores, a butcher, cafes, sports, sailing and golf clubs, a museum, indigenous art gallery, a pharmacy and medical services.
- Dunwich is the closest departure point for Brown Lake and Blue Lake. Brown Lake can be reached by car, Blue Lake is a decent walk.



- The only way to see the southern part of the island is to take a 4WD onto Main Beach on the eastern side of the island at low tide. Check tide times to plan your trip. A beach permit is required.
